

Mt. Aso is an active volcano.

Accessible routes may vary depending on the volcanic alert levels. Follow the designated climbing routes. When climbing around Mt Nakadake and Takadake, bring your helmet and goggles to protect your head and eyes from volcanic ash and cinders. Cover your mouth with wet towels when you smell volcanic gas.

Winter (1 December -19 March)	AM9:00	PM4:30



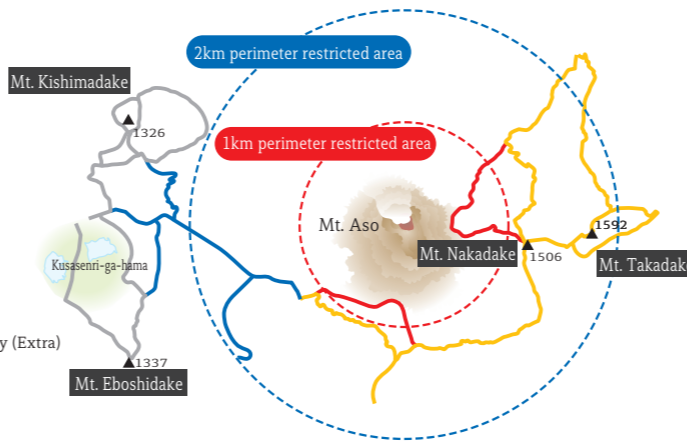

 - Yellow line Level 2 Details of Volcanic Activity (Extra)

- ※No restricted area in Level 1
